RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE AUTHORITY'S POLICY REGARDING CONFERENCE ATTENDANCE

WHEREAS, the Association of Environmental Authorities, the Water Environment Federation and other groups regularly schedule conferences and seminars designed to disseminate technical, management and regulatory information to appointed members and employees of public sewerage authorities; and

WHEREAS, attendance at such conferences and seminars is beneficial to appointed members and employees in fulfilling their responsibilities in the management and operation of The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, limited funds are available for such purposes in the annual operating budget of the Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority that the following policy governing attendance and expenses for conferences and seminars be adopted:

CONFERENCE AND SEMINAR ATTENDANCE POLICY

A. ATTENDANCE

1. Attendance at conferences and seminars shall be limited to the Chairman and four additional members of the Board, the Executive Director, and a maximum of three employees to be determined by the Executive Director. The number of Board Members and employees authorized to attend may be limited to less than the amount specified in this resolution due to the availability of funds appropriated in the adopted Budget.

2. In order that all Board Members have an opportunity to participate in conferences and

seminars, attendance shall be rotated among them.

B. EXPENSES

1. The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority will assume the following costs, either paid directly or on a reimbursement basis for all Board Members and employees of the Authority previously authorized to attend a conference or seminar:

a. Registration Fees

b. Transportation costs, including mileage at the rate established each year by the Internal Revenue Service, parking and tolls

c. Hotel accommodations

d. Meals and gratuities, not to exceed \$100.00 per day

- The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority will not assume the costs nor reimburse Board Members for any of the following:
 - Expenses incurred by a spouse or any other individual accompanying a Board Member or employee to a conference or seminar

b. Expenses for entertainment, sightseeing or alcoholic beverages

- c. Expenses incurred by a Board Member or employee as a result of an election to travel to a conference destination prior to the start of the conference or to extend a stay beyond the end of the conference
- 3. All requests for reimbursement of authorized expenses shall be submitted to the Executive Director on an Authority voucher accompanied by receipts for same.

WHEREAS, previously The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority entered into an agreement with American Cyanamid whereby American Cyanamid sold to the Authority its former wastewater treatment facilities which facilities were then modified and connected to those treatment facilities owned by the Authority creating a unified treatment process operated and owned by the SRVSA; and

WHEREAS, part of the facilities acquired from American Cyanamid in that transaction included a carbon absorption system, incinerator for the disposal of sludge, an incinerator for the regeneration of the activated carbon and an underground storage tank farm; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has been in negotiations with American Cyanamid's successor Wyeth, now Pfizer Chemicals, concerning the disposal of the activated carbon that was left in the carbon absorption system tankage after the unit was taken out of service by ACCO; and

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to demolish the activated carbon system and all associated tankage and structures in order to make that land available for other uses by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has received a proposal dated January 28, 2013 from CDM Smith (copy attached hereto and made part of this resolution) to provide the engineering consulting services related to the preparation of contract documents for the demolition of the Former Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (a.k.a. Carbon Towers) formerly owned and operated by American Cyanamid and one (1) UST located at the SRVSA Treatment Plant for the not to exceed cost of \$22,900.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority Board of Commissioners that it hereby accepts CDM Smith's cost proposal dated January 28, 2013 for engineer services related to contract document preparation for the demolition of the Former Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (a.k.a. Re: Demolition of the Former American Cyanamid

Chemical Company (ACCO) Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (a.k.a. Carbon Towers)

CDM Smith has provided a proposal for engineering services related to the demolition of the former American Cyanamid Chemical Company (ACCO) Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, commonly known as the "Carbon Towers". Approximately seven (7) years ago, CDM had prepared preliminary contract documents for the demolition of this facility, where the scope of work at that time included the demolition of Building 603 and the UST farm. However, the UST farm has been removed by the Authority last year, and the demolition of Building 603 will be performed under a separate contract that will focus on the relocation of electrical switchgear, pumps and piping for the sludge handling system and motor control centers and air compressors for the multimedia filtration system.

plans for the updating of existing proposal is specifications to reflect the current state of the Carbon Towers, which is that there will be provisions for the disposal of any residual carbon found in the large carbon regeneration incinerator. The cost of the collection and disposal of any carbon found will be borne by Pfizer, as part of a previous agreement governing the removal and disposal of residual granular carbon that was found throughout this system. All of this carbon, with the exception of any residual carbon in the large incinerator, has been removed and properly disposed.

Under this proposal, CDM Smith will prepare updated preliminary and final contract documents for the project. The final contract documents will use the Authority's standard "front-end" bid document, tailored for this project. Bid administration will be performed by the Authority staff. Also, this proposal does not have any provisions for demolition inspection, as that will be performed mainly by Authority staff, with periodic visits by CDM Smith. The total cost of this proposal is \$22,900.

I recommend acceptance of this proposal in the amount of \$22,900 and authorize CDM Smith to proceed with the work as specified.
