**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REISSUANCE OF
A NON-DOMESTIC WASTEWATER DISCHARGE PERMIT TO
WYETH HOLDINGS LLC.**

WHEREAS, The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority has an established Industrial Pretreatment Program to allow for and regulate the discharge of industrial effluent and/or groundwater via a permit program; and

WHEREAS Wyeth Holdings LLC, located at East Main Street, in Bridgewater, New Jersey, with offices at 20 Polhemus Lane, in Bridgewater, NJ, is regulated via the Non-Domestic Wastewater Discharge Permit No. 8D; and,

WHEREAS, Wyeth Holdings LLC has requested that the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority (SRVSA) reissue a Non-Domestic Wastewater Discharge Permit to them since their present permit is expiring. The new discharge permit will regulate the discharge from the facility. The permit, if approved, will be effective for five (5) years.

WHEREAS, the above referenced industry has agreed to abide by all of the rules and regulations of the Authority concerning the discharge of non-domestic wastewater to the Authority's system; and

WHEREAS, a thirty-day Public Comment Period was held to receive written comments or to request that the SRVSA hold a non-adversarial Public Hearing. No public comments were received during the Public Comment Period, nor were there any requests for a non-adversarial Public Hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority that it hereby authorizes the reissuance of Non-Domestic Wastewater Discharge Permit 8E for Wyeth Holdings LLC located at East Main Street, in Bridgewater, New Jersey, with offices at 20 Polhemus Lane, in Bridgewater, NJ.



SUBJECT: Discharge Permit Reissue for Wyeth Holdings LLC

Wyeth Holdings LLC has applied to The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority (SRVSA) for the renewal of Non-Domestic Wastewater Discharge Permit 8D.

The Wyeth Holdings LLC site was formerly known as American Cyanamid Company. The facility is primarily located in Bridgewater Township, adjacent to the Raritan River with a small parcel located in adjacent Bound Brook, and with offices at 20 Polhemus Lane, in Bridgewater, NJ. Between 1915 and 1999 the site was used for the manufacture of pharmaceuticals and other chemicals and dyes on the site. In 1983, the site was added to EPA's National Priorities List of known releases or threatened releases of hazardous substances, pollutants or contaminants due to impacts from past practices and organic chemicals. In 1999 the facility ceased manufacturing and all subsequent activities are related to site remediation as overseen by USEPA/NJDEP.

SRVSA previously accepted at least 650,000 gallons per day of extracted groundwater and stormwater of varying amounts, where the extracted groundwater is now treated on-site by Wyeth Holdings LLC. Under the proposed permit, the discharge to SRVSA consists primarily of stormwater with some incidental impacted shallow groundwater. The proposed permit also includes procedures for accepting water from Lagoon 7 on an as needed campaign withdrawal basis. The purpose of this permit is to regulate the discharge of groundwater and stormwater from this remediation site. If approved, the permit will be effective for five years.

Wyeth Holdings is regulated as a Significant Industrial User.

Public notice regarding this permit renewal was issued on April 3, 2020. No comments from either the public or Wyeth Holdings LLC were received during the Public Comment Period, which closed on May 2, 2020.

**RESOLUTION ENDORSING AND APPROVING PERMANENT STATUS

WHEREAS, the Personnel Committee, based on its review of memos from Michael Ingenito, Chief Plant Operator and Anthony Tambasco, Plant Superintendent, it has been reported that Eric Burns has successfully completed his 90-day probationary period on May 4, 2020 as required by Article VII, Section 7 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement and is recommending that Eric Burns be made permanent in that position.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority Board of Commissioners that they accept the Personnel Committee's recommendation and hereby approve the granting of permanent status of Eric Burns to the position of Solid Division Assistant Operator; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Burns will be paid at the rate of \$35.27/hour in accordance with Appendix A of the Collective Bargaining Agreement of January 1, 2020.

**SEWER EXTENSION RESOLUTION RE-APPROVAL
GREEN VILLAGE
HILLSBOROUGH TOWNSHIP
BLOCK 141 LOT 30.01, 30.02 AND 30.03**

WHEREAS, an application has been received from Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority for construction of a sewer collection system and a sewer connection to the appropriate Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority line or lines to allow the discharge of sewage to be received and treated at and by the facilities of the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority; and

WHEREAS, such sewer connection has been calculated to discharge a flow of 33,900 gpd from a development that includes six (6) buildings with a combined total of one-hundred four (104) market-rate and twenty-six (26) affordable residential units and a one-hundred thirty (130) bedroom hotel with a seventy five (75) seat restaurant; and

WHEREAS, the project is located along Woodruff Boulevard near the intersection with Route 206 and includes the construction of 1,288 linear feet of 8-inch PVC gravity sewer, as shown on plans (five sheets) entitled:

Amended Site Plans and Final Construction Plans for Green Village, Block 141 – Lots 30.01, 30.02 & 30.03 Hillsborough Township, Somerset County, New Jersey, prepared by Van Cleef Engineering Associates, dated August 27, 2019 and revised through March 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this application is for the re-approval of a prior sewer extension approval (Resolution No. 12-0723-1) due to modifications to the existing design, and the applicant is seeking to rescind and supersede Resolution No. 12-0723-1 in its entirety; and

WHEREAS, due to New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's strict limits on chlorination byproducts, the flow generated from this application only includes domestic sewage and does not include the acceptance of backwash and drain down discharges from any proposed swimming pools; and

WHEREAS, said application has been reviewed for conformance with the applicable wastewater management plans and documents and available permitted design treatment capacity, only, and is recommended for approval by, Sherwin Ulep, P.E., the Authority Engineer; and

WHEREAS, the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority sewer connection fee for this application shall be reviewed and calculated in accordance with current Authority connection fee policy prior to obtaining any building permits, and where each dwelling unit will be charged a minimum of one (1) EDU regardless of size;

BE IT RESOLVED by The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority that it hereby consents to the construction of the above stated collection system, such consent being in accordance with the provisions of R.S.40:14A-29; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority does hereby approve the application of Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority to connect to the Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority collection system and to deliver sewage to the facilities of the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority, subject to further approval of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED this approval is not, nor shall it be construed to be, an allocation or guarantee of future capacity, and, further, that the connection fee or fees in effect at the time such connection is to be made shall be paid to the Authority in accordance with the Authority's regulations pertaining thereto and the terms of a Connection Fee Agreement entered into by and between the Applicant and the Authority on or before the date of adoption of this Resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED this consent and approval will terminate if the Applicant fails to complete construction of said collection facilities and to make connection thereof and commence delivery of sewage to the facilities of the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority within two (2) years of the date hereof; and the Department of Environmental Protection is hereby notified that all time extension requests of this consent and approval must be approved by the Authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Executive Director of the Authority is hereby directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Department of Environmental Protection and Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority and the Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority is hereby directed to immediately notify the Authority when it receives notice and a request for the herein above project to be connected to the municipal sewer system.

This application is for the re-approval of a prior sewer extension approval (Resolution No. 12-0723-1) due to modification to the existing design. The applicant is proposing a mixed-use development that includes five (5) residential buildings with market rate and affordable housing units and a hotel with restaurant seating. The project site is located along Woodruff Boulevard near the intersection with Route 206 and includes the construction of 1,288 linear feet of 8-inch PVC gravity sewer.

The development will generate an average total flow of 33,900 gallons per day (gpd) as calculated below:

26 Affordable Housing Units

- 5 1-Bedroom Units (150 gpd/unit) – 750 gpd
- 15 2-Bedroom Units (225 gpd/unit) – 3,375 gpd
- 6 3-Bedroom Units (300 gpd/unit) – 1,800 gpd

104 Market Rate Units

- 104 1-Bedroom Units (150 gpd/unit) – 15,600 gpd

130 Bedroom Hotel (75 gpd/bedroom) – 9,750 gpd

75 Seat Restaurant (35 gpd/seat) – 2,625 gpd

This application is in compliance with applicable wastewater management plans and documents and there is currently sufficient treatment capacity for the proposed contributory flow. If approved, this application will rescind and supersede Resolution No. 12-0723-1 in its entirety.

Due to New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's strict limits on chlorination byproducts, the flow generated from this application only includes domestic sewage and does not include the acceptance of any backwash and drain down discharges from proposed swimming pools.

The developer/applicant has signed an Agreement with the Authority whereby the developer/applicant agrees to pay the Connection Fee to the Authority prior to applying for the necessary construction/ plumbing permits. This application is hereby recommended for approval.
