**WHEREAS**, The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority uses a Sodium Chlorite-Based Odor Control Chemical & Dousing System in the operation of its treatment facility; and

**WHEREAS**, the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A.: 40A:11-1 et. seq. requires that all public purchasing in excess of \$53,000.00 must be publicly advertised and bids received; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et.seq., The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority (the "Authority") through the public bidding process on September 12, 2024, awarded a contract commencing January 1, 2025 to Evoqua Water Technologies, LLC for a SODIUM CHLORITE-BASED ODOR CONTROL CHEMICAL & DOUSING SYSTEM for a one-year time period for a total price of \$118,425.00 with an option to extend the contract for one additional year time period; and

**WHEREAS**, the contract is due to expire on December 31, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority is desirous of extending the contract for a one-year time period from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026, and where Evoqua Water Technologies, LLC has provided this service in an acceptable manner; and

**WHEREAS**, Evoqua Water Technologies, LLC has agreed to extend the contract for Furnishing and Delivery of a SODIUM CHLORITE-BASED ODOR CONTROL CHEMICAL & DOUSING SYSTEM for a one-year time period from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026, in accordance with the current rate index of 2.0% (increase of \$2,368.50) for an amount not to exceed \$120,793.50 and all terms and conditions as set forth in the existing contract.







M&M HILLSBOROUGH WEST TRACT SUBDIVISION AT  
HAMILTON ROAD, HILLSBOROUGH TOWNSHIP  
BLOCK 182 LOT 11.01**

**WHEREAS**, an application has been received from M&M Realty Partners at Hillsborough, LLC for construction of a sewer collection system and a sewer connection to the appropriate Hillsborough Township Municipal Utilities Authority line or lines to allow the discharge of sewage to be received and treated at and by the facilities of the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority, and

**WHEREAS**, such sewer connection has been calculated to discharge a flow of 58,800 gpd from a proposed 196 single-family dwelling subdivision; and





**WHEREAS**, on August 28, 2023, The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority (SRVSA) Board adopted Resolution No. 23-0828-7 authorizing the execution of the Master Customer Agreement with PSE&G for an energy audit to be performed at no cost to SRVSA, with the potential (subject to separate approval) for the design, procurement and installation of energy efficient measures, with funding advanced by PSE&G upon completion of certain conditions for approved construction and engineering costs, having a five year repayment period; and

- 1) Interior and Exterior Lighting
- 2) Lighting Controls
- 3) Fix Aeration Header Leaks
- 4) Replace One (1) Aeration Blower – Existing Location
- 5) Replace Diffusers
- 6) Programable Thermostats

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of the Limited Notice to Proceed is to authorize PSE&G to prepare engineering design drawings for the aforementioned EEMs and prepare bid-ready construction documents for SRVSA to utilize in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, in the event a construction contract is awarded to the lowest responsible bidder (subject to PSE&G review and approval of the approved project costs) a separate Resolution of the Board will be necessary in order to approve the Customer Repayment Agreement, in order for PSE&G to fund approved project costs; and



**WHEREAS**, the definition of “Sludge” in the proposed 3M JCO “means the solids, semi-solids, precipitates, and liquids, including biosolids, that are (i) generated from any Wastewater Treatment Plant (other than the treated effluent from such a plant) or from any Public Water System’s water-supply treatment plant; (ii) produced as a result of the storage or physical, chemical, or biological treatment of domestic or industrial sewage or Wastewaters; (iii) generated as residue by the processes of any Treatment Works; or (iv) discharged as domestic or industrial Wastewater into a sewage system”; and

**WHEREAS**, the definition of “Wastewater” in the proposed 3M JCO “means residential, commercial, industrial, or agricultural liquid waste, sewage, stormwater runoff, or any combination thereof, or other residue discharged to or collected by a sewerage system. It is the intention of this JCO that the definition of “Wastewater” be as broad, expansive, and inclusive as possible.”; and

**WHEREAS**, the definition of “Released Claims” in the proposed 3M JCO includes all “Covered Conduct”; and

**WHEREAS**, the definition of “Released Claims” also includes “any Claim for cost recovery or contribution, including pursuant to section 107 or 113 of CERCLA (42 U.S.C. sec. 9607, 9613) or any State or federal statute related to liability (which this JCO resolves) for the Discharge or threatened Discharge of PFAS”; and

**WHEREAS**, the “Release” in the proposed 3M JCO states that that the Settling Plaintiffs “on behalf of and for the benefit of all the State’s Political Subdivisions, citizens, and residents, fully

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and forever release all Released Entities from all Released Claims and fully discharge all Released Claims against all Released Entities”; and

**WHEREAS**, the State’s Political Subdivisions are defined in the 3M JCO to include the “any city, borough, town, township, village, county, or other political subdivision of the State, or any agency or instrumentality of one or more therefore” which would include the Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority (the “Authority”); and

**WHEREAS**, the “Covenant Not To Sue” is defined in the proposed 3M JCO to include anything within the scope of the Release, Covered Conduct or Covered Harm and further states: “For the avoidance of doubt, the term “Covenant Not To Sue” includes any Claim that could be asserted against any Released Entity by any Releasor—including in any corporate, personal, direct, representative, derivative, class, or individual capacity—in any federal, state, or local action or proceeding (whether judicial, arbitral, regulatory, or administrative) to recover damages or funds for any Person who owns, Operates, manages, or controls any airport, fire department, Firefighting Training Academy, Hazardous Waste Facility, Private Potable Well, Site, Solid Waste Facility, Treatment Works, Wastewater Treatment Plant, Water Purveyor, or Water System in the State or within the State’s jurisdiction. It is the intention of this JCO that the definition of “Covenant Not To Sue” be as broad, expansive, and inclusive as possible.”; and

**WHEREAS**, the “Covenant Not To Sue” in the proposed 3M JCO states that “the Releasors absolutely, unconditionally, and irrevocably covenant not at any time hereafter, whether directly or indirectly or individually or collectively, to sue or take administrative action or commence, bring, file, assign, or prosecute . . . or to otherwise seek to establish liability for any Released Claim against any Released Entity in any forum whatsoever . . . .”; and

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**WHEREAS**, the 3M JCO defines the Releasors to include “all of the State’s Political Subdivisions and their departments, agencies, authorities, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind, and attorneys, and any Person claiming by or through any of the foregoing”, which includes the Authority; and

**WHEREAS**, the “Exclusive Remedy” in the proposed 3M JCO states: “The relief provided for in this JCO shall be the sole and exclusive remedy for all Releasors with respect to any Released Claim, and the Released Entities shall not be subject to liability or expense of any kind with respect to any Released Claim other than as set forth in this JCO.”; and

**THE PROPOSED DUPONT JUDICIAL CONSENT ORDER**

**WHEREAS**, the proposed Dupont JCO has a Release, Covenant Not To Sue similar to the 3M JCO; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed DuPont JCO defines “Released Statewide PFAS Claims” to include “any and all PFAS Claims that directly or indirectly, in any way, arose from, were based on, involved, or were caused by “Covered PFAS Conduct” or “Covered PFAS Harm” occurring at least in part prior to the JCO Entry Date”; and

**WHEREAS**, “Covered PFAS Conduct” is defined in the proposed DuPont JCO to include “any transport, treatment, storage, disposal, or arrangement for transportation, treatment, storage, or disposal, or use of PFAS-containing Sludge or PFAS-containing Wastewater (from any site, facility, or location) . . . .”; and

**WHEREAS**, “Sludge” is defined in the proposed DuPont JCO as “the solids, semi-solids, precipitates, and liquids, including biosolids, that are (i) generated from any Wastewater Treatment

Plant (other than the treated effluent from such a plant) or from any Public Water System's water-supply treatment plant; (ii) produced as a result of the storage or physical, chemical, or biological treatment of domestic or industrial sewage or Wastewater; (iii) generated as residue by the processes of any Treatment Works; or (iv) discharged as domestic or industrial Wastewater into a sewerage system"; and

**WHEREAS**, "Wastewater" is defined in the proposed DuPont JCO as "residential, commercial, industrial, or agricultural liquid waste, sewage, stormwater runoff, or any combination thereof, or other residue discharged to or collected by a sewerage system. It is the intention of this JCO that the definition of "Wastewater" be as broad, expansive, and inclusive as possible"; and

**WHEREAS**, "Released Statewide PFAS Claims" in the proposed DuPont JCO also includes "any PFAS Claim for cost recovery or contribution, including pursuant to section 107 or 113 of CERCLA (42 U.S.C. sec. 9607, 9613) (or any State or federal statute related to liability (which this JCO resolves) for the Discharge or threatened Discharge of PFAS"; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed DuPont JCO defines "Statewide PFAS Releasers" to include "all of the State's Political Subdivisions and their departments, agencies, authorities, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind, and attorneys, and any Person claiming by or through any of the foregoing"; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed DuPont JCO defines "Political Subdivision" to mean "any city, borough, town, township, village, county, or other political subdivision of the State, or any agency or instrumentality of one or more thereof" which includes the Authority; and

**WHEREAS**, the "Statewide PFAS Release and Covenant Not To Sue" in the proposed DuPont JCO states "the Statewide PFAS Releasers, acting through and by the Attorney General and on

behalf of the State and all executive and administrative offices, departments, authorities, and instrumentalities of the State government . . . for the benefit of all the State’s Political Subdivisions, citizens, and residents, fully and forever release all Released Entities from all Released Statewide PFAS Claims and fully discharge all Released Statewide PFAS Claims against all Released Entities. . . . It is the intention of this JCO that the definition of “Statewide PFAS Release” be as broad, expansive, and inclusive as possible, so as to give the Released Entities the broadest possible bar against any liability in any way arising from, based on, involving, or caused by any Covered PFAS Conduct or Covered PFAS Harm. . . . This JCO shall be a complete bar to any Released Statewide PFAS Claim.”; and

**THE AEA MOTION FOR INTERVENTION**

**WHEREAS**, the Association of Environmental Authorities of New Jersey (the “AEA”) has authorized the filing of a motion to intervene in the above-mentioned litigation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority desires to be named as an independent party in the aforementioned AEA motion for intervention.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by The Somerset Raritan Valley Sewerage Authority Board of Commissioners as follows:

1. The Authority authorizes its counsel to include the Authority as a separate independent entity in the AEA motion for intervention and to further authorize alternative relief, such as appearing as *amicus curiae*, for the purpose of requesting the Court to amend the proposed 3M JCO and amend the proposed Dupont JCO so that the Authority would not be barred in the future from bringing a claim against the Settling Defendants (as defined in

the proposed 3M JCO) and the Settling Defendants (as defined in the proposed DuPont JCO) for wastewater and sludge containing PFAS.

2. The Executive Director, staff, counsel and consultants are hereby authorized to take any other actions necessary or desirable to effectuate the terms and conditions of his Resolution.
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.


